INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to provide you with information regarding certain resolutions to be proposed at the 2019 AGM to seek approval of the Shareholders, including but not limited to (a) the proposed grant of general mandates to the Directors for the issue and repurchase of Shares; (b) re-election of retiring Directors; and (c) refreshment of the Scheme Mandate Limit.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

GENERAL MANDATES TO ISSUE AND REPURCHASE SHARES

At the 2019 AGM, the Directors propose to seek the approval of the Shareholders to grant to the Directors the Issue Mandate and the Repurchase Mandate.

Issue Mandate

An ordinary resolution will be proposed at the 2019 AGM to grant a general and unconditional mandate to the Directors to allot, issue and otherwise deal with new Shares up to a maximum of 20% of the number of issued Shares as at the date of granting the Issue Mandate. In addition, a separate ordinary resolution will further be proposed to approve the addition to the Issue Mandate so granted to the Directors an amount representing the number of issued Shares repurchased by the Company pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate. The Issue Mandate (if granted) shall continue in force until the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company or any earlier date as referred to in the relevant resolution in the notice of the 2019 AGM. The Board would like to state that it has no immediate plan to allot and issue any new Shares pursuant to the Issue Mandate (if granted).

Repurchase Mandate

An ordinary resolution will be proposed at the 2019 AGM to grant a general and unconditional mandate to the Directors to repurchase the fully paid-up Shares on the Stock Exchange, provided that the total number of Shares to be purchased shall not exceed 10% of the number of issued Shares at the date of granting the Repurchase Mandate. The Repurchase Mandate (if granted) shall continue in force until the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company or any earlier date as referred to in the relevant resolution in the notice of the 2019 AGM. The Board would like to state that it has no immediate plan to repurchase any Shares pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate (if granted).

An explanatory statement to provide relevant information in respect of the Repurchase Mandate is set out in Appendix I to this circular.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the number of Shares in issue was 4,301,816,000 Shares. Accordingly, subject to the passing of the resolutions for the approval of the Issue Mandate and Repurchase Mandate and assuming no repurchase or issue of Shares prior to the 2019 AGM, the exercise of the Repurchase Mandate in full would enable the Company to repurchase up to 430,181,600 Shares and the exercise of the Issue Mandate in full would enable the Company to allot, issue and deal with up to 860,363,200 new Shares.

RE-ELECTION OF RETIRING DIRECTORS

According to Article 84 of the Articles of Association, at each annual general meeting of the Company, one-third of the Directors for the time being (or, if their number is not a multiple of three, the number nearest to but not less than one-third) shall retire from office by rotation provided that every Director shall be subject to retirement at an annual general meeting at least once every three years. A retiring Director shall be eligible for re-election. In accordance with the Article 84 of the Articles of Association, Mr. Wang Chen (“**Mr. Wang**”) and Ms. Li Mingqi (“**Ms. Li**”) shall retire from office by rotation at the 2019 AGM. All the retiring Directors, being eligible, will respectively offer themselves for re-election at the 2019 AGM.

Ordinary resolutions will be proposed at the 2019 AGM to re-elect Mr. Wang and Ms. Li as Directors respectively.

The Nomination Committee has considered the extensive experience of Mr. Wang in development on software of quality assurance and general automated test system and the extensive experience of Ms. Li in financial management, and their working profile and other perspectives, skills and experience as set out in Appendix II to this circular. The Nomination Committee is satisfied that each of Mr. Wang and Ms. Li has the required character, integrity and experience to continuously fulfil his/her role as an independent non-executive Director effectively. Mr. Wang and Ms. Li possess the perspective, skill and experience that can bring to the Board and ensure diversity in the composition of the Board.

The Nomination Committee has assessed and reviewed the written confirmation of independence from each of Mr. Wang and Ms. Li based on the independence criteria as set out in the Listing Rules. The Board is of the view that there is nothing that would affect the exercise of independent judgement by each of Mr. Wang and Ms. Li. Accordingly, with the recommendation of the Nomination Committee, the Board believes the re-election of each of Mr. Wang and Ms. Li as independent non-executive Director would be in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders as a whole and has proposed that all the above retiring Directors to stand for re-election as Directors at the 2019 AGM.

Particulars of each of Mr. Wang and Ms. Li required to be disclosed pursuant to Rule 13.74 of the Listing Rules are set out in Appendix II to this circular.

REFRESHMENT OF THE SCHEME MANDATE LIMIT UNDER THE SHARE OPTION SCHEME

Background of the Scheme Mandate Limit

The Share Option Scheme was adopted by the Company on 22 March 2012 for the purpose of recognising and motivating the contribution of the eligible persons to the Group. Apart from the Share Option Scheme, the Company has no other share option scheme currently in force.

Pursuant to the Listing Rules and the terms of the Share Option Scheme, the maximum number of the Shares in respect of which options may be granted under the Share Option Scheme and any other share option schemes of the Company must not exceed the Scheme Mandate Limit. The Scheme Mandate Limit may be refreshed by approval of the Shareholders in general meeting from time to time, provided that the total number of Shares which may be issued upon exercise of all options to be granted under the Share Option Scheme and any other share option schemes of the Company as refreshed must not exceed 10% of the number of issued Shares as at such date of approval. In this connection, options previously granted under the Share Option Scheme and any other share option schemes of the Group (including options outstanding, cancelled, lapsed or exercised) will not be counted for the purpose of calculating the Scheme Mandate Limit as refreshed. No options may be granted if this will result in the number of Shares which may be issued upon exercise of all outstanding options granted and yet to be exercised under the Share Option Scheme exceed 30% of the Shares in issue from time to time.

The Company has not refreshed the Scheme Mandate Limit since its adoption of the Share Option Scheme. The existing Scheme Mandate Limit is 120,000,000 shares of HK\$0.01 each in the share capital of the Company (each, a “**Pre-Consolidation Share**”) before the Share Consolidation, representing 10% of the Pre-Consolidation Shares in issue upon completion of listing of the Pre-Consolidation Shares on the Stock Exchange on 18 April 2012. 2. As a result of the Bonus Issue which total effect on 21 February 2014, the number of Pre-Consolidation Shares issuable under the outstanding Options has been adjusted from 120,000,000 to 600,000,000 with effect from the even date.
3. A total of 72,650,000 Options were lapsed during the year ended 31 March 2015.
4. During the year ended 31 March 2016, a total of 184,350,000 Options were lapsed and the number of Shares issuable under the outstanding Options was adjusted from 343,000,000 Pre-Consolidation Shares to 68,600,000 Shares because of the Share Consolidation.
5. As a result of the completion of the rights issue of the Company on 28 April 2016, the number of Shares issuable under the outstanding Options has been adjusted from 68,480,000 to 83,123,522 with effect from the even date. A total of 24,275,342 Options were lapsed during the year ended 31 March 2017.

Reasons for the proposed refreshment of the Scheme Mandate Limit

Since the adoption of the Share Option Scheme and up to the Latest Practicable Date, there is no refreshment on the Scheme Mandate Limit. However, the number of Shares in issue has been substantially increased mainly as a result of the rights issues as detailed in the prospectus of the Company dated 7 April 2016. As at the Latest Practicable Date, the total number of Shares in issue has been raised to 4,301,816,000 Shares. Based on the terms of the Share Option Scheme, as all the Options previously granted have been lapsed, the total number of Options that can be further granted under the existing Scheme Mandate Limit is 78,912,000 (as adjusted under after the Share Consolidation), being approximately 1.83% of the total number of Shares in issue as at the Latest Practicable Date.

The Directors consider that it is in the interest of the Company and the Shareholders as a whole to refresh the Scheme Mandate Limit to the 10% provided under Chapter 17 of the Listing Rules, so that the Company could have more flexibility to provide more incentive to the eligible participants for their contribution and continuing efforts and motivate them to contribute further to the success of the Group. For these reasons, the Directors will propose the passing of an ordinary resolution at the 2019 AGM for refreshing the Scheme Mandate Limit.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, there were 4,301,816,000 Share in issue. Assuming no issue or repurchase of Shares prior to the 2019 AGM and upon the refreshment of the Scheme Mandate Limit under the Share Option Scheme by the Shareholders at the 2019 AGM, the Company may grant options entitling holders thereof to subscribe for 430,181,600 Shares, representing 10% of the issued Shares as at the date of approval of the refreshment of the Scheme Mandate Limit by the Shareholders at the 2019 AGM which do not include options that are outstanding, cancelled or lapsed as at the date of the 2019 AGM, which is within the said limit of 30% of the total number of Shares in issue from time to time as required under the Share Option Scheme.

The refreshment of the Scheme Mandate Limit is conditional upon:

- (1) the passing of an ordinary resolution by the Shareholders to approve the refreshment of the Scheme Mandate Limit at the 2019 AGM; and

A form of proxy is enclosed for your use at the 2019 AGM. Shareholders are requested to complete and return the form of proxy to the Share Registrar as soon as practicable but in any event not later than 3:00 p.m. on Tuesday, 24 September 2019 or not less than 48 hours before the time appointed for holding the adjourned meeting. The lodging of a form of proxy will not preclude you from attending and voting in person, at the 2019 AGM or any adjournment thereof should you so wish, and in such case, the form of proxy previously submitted shall be deemed to be revoked.

Pursuant to Rule 13.39(4) of the Listing Rules, any vote of shareholders at a general meeting must be taken by poll except where the chairman, in good faith, decides to allow a resolution which relates purely to a procedural or administrative matter to be voted on by a show of hands. As such, all the resolutions set out in the notice of the 2019 AGM will be voted by poll. An announcement on the poll results will be published by the Company after the 2019 AGM in the manner prescribed under the Listing Rules.

In order to be eligible to attend and vote at the 2019 AGM, all transfer of Shares accompanied by the relevant share certificate(s) must be lodged with the branch share registrar and transfer office of the Company in Hong Kong, Tricor Investor Services Limited, at Level 54, Hopewell Centre, 183 Queen's Road East, Hong Kong for registration not later than 4:30 p.m. on Friday, 20 September 2019.

RECOMMENDATIONS

The Directors consider that (a) the proposed grant of the Issue Mandate (including the extended Issue Mandate) and the Repurchase Mandate; (b) the proposed re-election of the retiring Directors; and (c) the proposed refreshment of the Scheme Mandate Limit are in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders as a whole. Accordingly, the Directors recommend that the Shareholders vote for the relevant resolutions set out in the notice of the 2019 AGM.

This Appendix serves as an explanatory statement, as required by the Listing Rules, to provide all the information in relation to the Repurchase Mandate for your consideration.

1. LISTING RULES RELATING TO THE REPURCHASES OF SHARES

The Listing Rules permit companies with a primary listing on the Stock Exchange to repurchase their securities on the Stock Exchange subject to certain restrictions. All proposed repurchases of securities on the Stock Exchange by a company with its primary listing on the Stock Exchange must be approved in advance by an ordinary resolution of its shareholders, either by way of a general mandate or by a specific approval of a particular transaction and that the shares to be repurchased must be fully paid up. A maximum of 10% of the number of issued Shares as at the date of passing the relevant resolution may be repurchased on the Stock Exchange.

2. SHARE CAPITAL

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the Company had 4,301,816,000 Shares in issue. Subject to the passing of the proposed resolution granting the Repurchase Mandate and assuming that no further Shares will be issued or repurchased by the Company prior to the 2019 AGM, the Company will be allowed under the Repurchase Mandate to repurchase a maximum of 430,181,600 Shares, representing 10% of the number of issued Shares as at the date of passing of the relevant resolution.

3. REASONS FOR REPURCHASES

Whilst the Directors do not presently intend to repurchase any Shares immediately, they believe that the flexibility afforded by the Repurchase Mandate would be beneficial to the Company and the Shareholders as a whole.

Repurchases of Shares will only be made when the Directors believe that such a repurchase will benefit the Company and the Shareholders. Such repurchases may, depending on the market conditions and funding arrangements of the Company at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net asset value per Share and/or its earnings per Share.

4. FUNDING OF REPURCHASES

Repurchases pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate would be financed entirely from the Company's available cash flow or working capital facilities. Any repurchases will be made out of funds of the Company legally permitted to be utilised in this connection in accordance with the Articles of Association, the Listing Rules and the applicable laws of the Cayman Islands.

5. IMPACT OF REPURCHASES

Based on the audited consolidated financial statements of the Company for the year ended 31 March 2019, being the date to which the most recent published audited accounts of the Company were made up, there might be a material adverse impact on the working capital or gearing position of the Company in the event that the Repurchase Mandate is exercised in full. However, the Directors do not propose to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such an extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the working capital requirements of the Company or the gearing levels which in the opinion of the Directors are from time to time appropriate for the Company.

6. DISCLOSURE OF INTERESTS

None of the Directors, and to the best of their knowledge, having made all reasonable enquiries, none of their close associates (as defined in the Listing Rules), have any present intention, if the Repurchase Mandate is approved by the Shareholders and subsequently exercised, to sell any Shares to the Company or its subsidiaries.

No core connected person (as defined in the Listing Rules) of the Company has notified the Company that he/she/it has a present intention to sell Shares to the Company, nor has undertaken not to do so, if the Repurchase Mandate is approved by the Shareholders and subsequently exercised.

7. DIRECTORS' UNDERTAKING

The Directors have undertaken to the Stock Exchange that, so far as the same may be applicable, they will exercise the Repurchase Mandate in accordance with the Listing Rules, the Articles of Association and the applicable laws of the Cayman Islands.

8. SHARE REPURCHASE MADE BY THE COMPANY

As at the Latest Practicable Date, no repurchases of Shares have been made by the Company during the last six months (whether on the Stock Exchange or otherwise).

9. TAKEOVERS CODE CONSEQUENCES

If as a result of a repurchase of Shares by the Company, Shareholders' proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases, such increases will be treated as an acquisition for the purpose of the Takeovers Code. As a result, a Shareholder, or group of Shareholders acting in concert, depending on the level of increase of its or their shareholding, could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rules 26 and 32 of the Takeovers Code.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, to the best of the knowledge and belief of the Directors, Mr. Wong Chit On ("**Mr. Wong**"), the chairman of the Company and an executive Director, is beneficially interested in 1,194,710,296 Shares held under Excel Time Investments Limited, a company controlled by him, representing approximately 27.77% of the issued share capital of the Company. In the event that the Directors exercise in full the power to repurchase Shares which are proposed to be granted pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate, the interest of Mr. Wong in the Company would increase to approximately 30.86%. As a result, Mr. Wong, together with the parties acting in concert, would be required to make a mandatory offer under Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code. The Company has no present intention to repurchase Shares to such extent that an obligation to make a general offer under the Takeovers Code will be triggered. Save as disclosed above, the Directors are not aware of any Shareholder or group of Shareholders acting in concert, who may become obliged to make a mandatory offer under Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code as a consequence of any purchases pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate.

The Directors have no intention to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to an extent as may result in the amount of Shares held by the public to fall below 25% of the total issued share capital of the Company.

Mr. Wang has renewed his letter of appointment with the Company on 21 June 2018 for a term of three years commencing on 25 June 2018, which is automatically renewable for successive terms of three years each commencing on the day next after the expiry of the then current term of appointment, subject to termination by either party by serving prior notice to the other party no less than three months’ notice in writing. He is subject to retirement by rotation and re-election at annual general meetings of the Company pursuant to the Articles of Association. Mr. Wang is currently entitled to a Director’s remuneration of HK\$100,000 per annum, which is determined with reference to his duties, responsibilities, the prevailing market conditions and the recommendation of the Remuneration Committee.

Save as disclosed above, as at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Wang did not (i) hold any directorships in any other listed companies in Hong Kong or overseas in the last three years; (ii) have any other major appointments and professional qualifications; (iii) hold any other position with the Company or other members of the Group; and (iv) have any relationship with any other Directors, senior management, substantial or controlling shareholders (as respectively defined in the Listing Rules) of the Company.

She was also an independent non-executive director of Sino Gas International Holdings, Inc., whose shares were previously listed on the Over-The-Counter Bulletin Board in the US, from March 2011 to November 2014. Ms. Li served as a business consultant of Seekers Advisors H.K. Limited and is currently an independent non-executive director of Neo-Neon Holdings Limited (Stock Code: 1868), whose shares are listed on the Main Board of the Stock Exchange.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Ms. Li does not have any interest in the Shares within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO.
